Genesis

Notes:

"Genesis is the book of beginnings; it provides a dramatic accounts of the origins of mankind and his universe, the intrusion of sin not the world, the catastrophic effects of its curse of the race, and the beginnings of God's plan to bless the nations through His seed." (John F. Walvoord, 1983) page 15

The Hebrew title for this book is 'In the beginning, from the first word. The English title, Genesis, from a transliteration of the Word Greek translation of the Hebrew word (הדָלָה tôwledâh, to-led-aw') found in Genesis 2:24 - This is <u>the history of</u> the heavens and the earth when they were created, in the day that the LORD God made the earth and the heavens...

Moses is the human author of the first five books of the Bible. They were written for the people of Israel as they were coming out of Egypt and preparing to go into the Promised Land. Genesis tells them how they ended up in Egypt four hundred years earlier.

"This account shows that the God who created Israel is the God who created the world and all who are in it." (John F. Walvoord, 1983) 27

The creation must be in subjection to the Creator.

Genesis 1

Notes:

Genesis 1 is one of the most Godcentric chapter in the Bible (Phillips).

How we view Genesis one impacts the way we view the rest of the Bible. If Genesis is myth or fable, then the whole Bible is called into question as unfactual and unreliable.

"If the Holy Spirit cannot be trusted when He tells of the *creation*, how can He be trusted when He tells of *salvation*?" (Phillips, 1980) page 35

Moses could not have written the Genesis creation account by accident or by his imagination. It runs counter to what every other culture on earth believed. It had to be divine revelation.

All scientific explanations about the universe and how it began are based on studying the universe as it is today, utilizing the laws of the universe as they are today and extrapolating backward. These all fail to answer the origin question because at some point the model or theory fails to identify the source of the origin.

In the Genesis origin account Moses is given by revelation the source of the universe's origin as well as its Creator.

Notes:

The Bible begins with the unapologetic statement that God exists. It also tells us that the universe has not always existed, but not when it was created, except for 'in the beginning'. We can note that God existed prior to the universe, though we are not told for how long.

The word קרָא bârâ' H1254 is only of God's creative acts. That God created ex nihilo (out of nothing) is implied in the context.

The creation account of Genesis is so simple and magnifies the infinite creative power of God. Compare it to the bizarre creation stories of other cultures.

It was God's Word that the universe to leap into existence. Our response to God's Word ought to be to leap in obedience.

Notes:

The 'greater' = the sun; the 'lesser' = the moon. How did Moses know that the sun is 'greater' than the moon. An uninformed observer might say the moon is larger than the sun.

'He made the stars also.' – God used five words to describe the creation of the entire universe outside our solar system. It has been said that there are more stars than there are grains of sand on every beach on earth.

God used fifty chapters of the Bible to describe the construction of the tabernacle, but only five words to describe the creation of the stars. That is divine perspective.

"The Bible is a handbook of redemption...It was nothing for God to create; to create He had only to speak. But to redeem, He had to suffer. That is the perspective of the Bible." (Phillips, 1980) page 43

"God is more interested in people than He is in planets, more interested in souls than in stars." (Phillips, 1980) page 44

As interesting as the recent Spacex launch was (May 2020), it only highlights man's broken view of God's universe. Notes:

All of humanity is descended from these first two, Adam and Eve. Adam is the federal head of all humanity. If you treat Genesis 1 as anything other than truth, then you also must throw out Romans five, which traces all sin back to Adam and sets Jesus up as the Second Adam. Without Romans 5 we would all be hopelessly lost in our sin.

Every new discovery, invention, and technology is an expression of man's dominion. Man has moved mountains, dammed rivers, and mined the depths of the earth. Even the exploration of space is an expression of man's dominion.
