Since we are genetically linked to Noah and his sons, we are all family – brothers and sisters.



Canaan was the father of the Canaanites, Israel's future nemesis. Moses was writing this as the people of God approached the Promised Land, occupied by the Canaanites who had been cursed by God and whom He planned to drive out of the land for the Israelites.

Shem is the ancestor of the Shemites through whom Abraham came. The Jews (and Jesus) are descended from the line of Shem.
