Genesis 17

Scriptures: Genesis 16:16-17:1 -Abram was eighty-six years old when Hagar bore Ishmael to Abram. 17:1 When Abram was ninetynine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am Almighty God; walk before Me and be blameless."

Notes:

Thirteen years pass between chapters 16 and 17 (Gen. 16:16 & 17:1). We are not told what happens in that time. We can only imagine the conflict of this divided home. Sarai despised Hagar and Ishmael was a wild one.

For thirteen years there has been silence from God and nothing worth noting happens in Abram's life.

It had been twenty-three years since God initially promised to make a great nation from Abram. For the last thirteen years Abram has been living under the false idea that Ishmael was the fulfilment of the promise. One might wonder, as he looked at the unruly of Ishmael there wasn't something wrong.

We can't know for certain if God delayed fulfilling the promise of an heir because of Abram's mistake with Hagar. As far as we can tell, God was silent during those thirteen years.

In this chapter all the threads of the promises God has made to Abraham are woven together into what we call the Abrahamic covenant.

Everything going on in the Middle East is an outworking of the clauses of this covenant.

And just as someone would be cut off from the people of God without circumcision, people will be cut off from the kingdom of God without Christ.

There was pain and blood as Abraham obeyed God in faith and ushered in the old covenant. There was pain and blood on that Good Friday as Jesus died on the cross for our sins to usher in the new covenant (Matt. 26:27-28). This was prophesied by Jeremiah (Jer. 31:31).
