In the last chapter, James introduced the idea of the 'law of liberty'. Later in this chapter he will tell us the role of love is the law of liberty.

## James 2:1-13 - Living Right without Partiality!

Scriptures: Romans 2:11 - For there is no partiality with God.

Leviticus 19:15 - You shall do no injustice in judgment. You shall not be partial to the poor, nor honor the person of the mighty. In righteousness you shall judge your neighbor. <sup>1</sup>My brethren, do not hold the faith of our Lord

Notes:

One of the challenges of living right in this wrong way world is understanding the relationship between faith and works. The Bible gives us instruction and examples of both what to do and what not to do. In this section James is telling us what shouldn't be seen in our faith – partiality.

Partiality - unfair bias in favor of one thing or person compared with another; favoritism.

Partiality is contrary to the nature of God (Rom. 2:11). God calls it unjust and unrighteous (Lev. 19:15).

Notes:

There are many things wrong with partiality. It is born out of 'evil thoughts' that produce wicked acts. It judges people on their outward appearance and not on who they are in God's kingdom. It implies that the rich man's soul is of more value than the poor man's soul.

Money, power, status, or any other human form of measurement does not determine a person's worth or righteousness. Scriptures:
Matthew 5:3 Blessed are the poor in spirit,
For theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Notes:

This does not suggest that all poor people are automatically saved. A poor person is much more aware of their needs than is a rich person. The poor are more inclined to the gospel because of this (Matt. 5:3).

'rich in faith' – because of their dependence upon God, the poor lean more heavily on their faith. The rich are more likely to lean on their riches

While the poor are poor in this world, they are rich in heaven. And chances are that because of their faith they will receive greater rewards in heaven than the rich will.

What we do with what God has given us, whether it is much or little, makes a difference in our relationship with God (Luke 12:21).

Luke 12:21 - "So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God."

1 John 4:7-11 - Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. 8 He who does not love does not know God, for God is love. 9 In this the

Romans 8:35-39 -Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? 36 As it is written:

"For Your sake we are killed all day long; We are accounted as sheep for the slaughter."

37 Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. 38 For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, 39 nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from

the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

1 John 3:16 - By this we know love, because He laid down His life for us. And we also ought to lay down our lives for the brethren.
17 But whoever has this world's goods, and sees his brother in need, and shuts up his heart from him, how does the love of God abide in him?

John 13:34-35 - A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. 35 By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."

'royal law' – only occurrence of this phrase in the Bible.

This phrase is repeated several times in the New Testament, most emphatically in (Matt. 22:35-40).

Partiality looks at the outside, but God looks at the heart (1 Sam. 16:7). Only God can see what is inside the human heart. Since we can't see what is in someone's heart, we are told to love them 'as yourself'. And since we love ourselves only one way, we are called to love everyone equally. And because James is focused on a faith that works, we don't need to feel love but are called to express love through our actions. The account of the widow's mites in Mark 12:41-44 is an example of that.

The obvious question then is, 'Who is my neighbor?' Jesus replied to that very question with the parable of the Good Samaritan. The conclusion is that we are called to love any needy human God gives us an opportunity to help. And that is regardless of their outward appearance or behaviors.

Love is the key to living right in this wrong way world. Love is God's nature (1 John 4:7-8) and it is how He relates to mankind (Rom. 5:8; 8:35-39) and it is how He expects us to relate to other humans made in His image (John 13:34). Responding to the needs of others is one of the proofs that God's love is in us (1 John 3:16).

#### Notes:

Implied in this is the elevation of sins like partiality to the grossness of murder and adultery.

Some people imagine a set of scales to determine if their good deeds outweigh their bad so that they will get to heaven. That is not how it works. We are bound to God by a great chain that is the law. Each commandment is a link in that chain. If you break one of the commandments, you break the chain linking you to God and there is no way to get to heaven. There is nothing any human can do to repair the chain. Only by faith in Christ and His perfect righteousness can anyone get to heaven (John 14:6).

Notes:

All humanity will be judged by God. Unbelievers will be judged by the law and condemned as guilty because they rejected the only way to be acquitted for their sins - the sacrificial death of Jesus. Believers will not be judged for their sins because Jesus took all our sins to the cross and took our condemnation. All our sins are washed away by His blood. But all our works will be judged to determine if they were worthy of heaven. For example, anything we did with partiality will be burned up and receive no reward. Everything we do as an expression of God's love will pass through the fire of judgment and be rewarded (1 Cor. 3:9-15).

## Notes:

This is a verse that we don't want to believe is true. Humanly speaking, we don't like the idea that there is a point of no return when it comes to mercy from God.

How we treat those are needy around us will impact our relationship with God (Prov. 21:13).

God in His perfect righteousness must judge sin – all sin. Because God is love He made a way for sinners to receive mercy, but there is only one way – Jesus Christ. When someone receives Christ as their Savior, they receive mercy rather than the judgment they deserve.
