In five of the seven letters to the  
churches in Revelation 2 and 3, they  
were called to repent.

Repentance is not just for people  
who are far from God, but also for  
people who should be closer to God.

'kingdom of heaven is at hand.' –  
How do we know that is true? One  
reason is because the King of the  
kingdom of heaven has come.

Notes:

There is a lot of similarity in appearance and message between John the Baptist and Elisha the Old Testament prophet (2 Kings 1:8).

There was a common belief that Elisha would come prior to the arrival of the Messiah. Jesus confirmed that belief (Mark 9:11-13). And then He pointed to John the Baptist as the fulfillment of that belief (Matt. 13-14).

Notes:

The Jordan River is not a beautiful stream of crystal-clear water. It is a muddy river. It is amazing that people came to the wilderness, to a muddy river, to man dressed in camel hair to be told they needed to repent, and they did it.

Confession is a necessary component of repentance. True confession is specific and personal (Psalm 32:5). When we confess, God forgives (1 John 1:9). It is Jesus who takes our sin away (John 1:29).

Notes:

The Pharisees and the Sadducees were the most spiritual people in the nation of Israel. John has no problem calling them out as ‘Brood of vipers.’ That was not a very politically correct thing to say. He is questioning their sincerity in seeking to be baptized. John is calling them out for the sin of presumption.

They presumed that Abraham’s favor with God carried over to them regardless of how they lived or what they believed.

Christians can make a similar mistake. By presuming that having once confessed, they no longer need to concern themselves with sin or holiness, they presume upon the sacrifice of Christ.

‘the wrath to come’ – a common theme of the Old Testament prophets was the fact that God disapproved of His people’s insincere worship or their idolatrous worship of false gods. God gave them two choices: repent and return to a pure worship of God in obedience to His Commands or experience His wrath in judgment. John is implying that these men know they are worthy of God’s judgment and are coming to engage in a religious exercise in the hopes they will escape the judgment they deserve.

‘Brood of vipers’ – Satan is referred to as a serpent in the Garden of Eden. Calling them children of the devil.

John is spiritually holy enough to baptize others with the baptism of repentance. But he knows that he is not holy enough to baptize the one who will come after him.

'Baptize you with the Holy Spirit.' – When we confess and repent, we are washed clean, baptized by the Holy Spirit. It is a spiritual baptism of cleansing and being made right with God. This happens at conversion. We then do water baptism as a symbol of what God did spiritually.

Everyone who came to John before Jesus was coming to be cleansed of their sin and to be made right with God. Jesus came without sin and was always right with God. His baptism was not to cleanse Him of His sin but to prepare Him to take on our sins.
