'cup' – is often used as a symbol for judgment (Rev. 14:9-10).

'cup of drunkenness' – Nations are acting toward Jerusalem in ways that are irrational – as if their senses have been dulled by drugs or alcohol (Psa. 75:8).

Zechariah lived in the sixth century before Christ. Islam didn't begin until the 7th century after Christ. All the nations around Israel are Islamic. Thirteen centuries before Islam existed God predicted the conflict that exists today between Israel and the nations around her. God also had a plan for what He was going to do about it.

One of Islam's basis tenets is the total elimination of not just the nation of Israel but the elimination from the earth of all Jews.

God is sovereign over everything including Israel's enemies.

Before God delivers His people He will bring all the nations against her in war.

Matthew 21:43-44 - "Therefore I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a nation bearing the fruits of it. 44 And whoever falls on this stone will be broken; but on whomever it falls, it will grind him to powder."

Isaiah 14:13-15 - For you have said in your heart: 'I will ascend into heaven,

I will exalt my throne above the stars of God; I will also sit on the mount of the congregation On the farthest sides of the north:

14 I will ascend above the heights of the clouds, I will be like the Most High.'

15 Yet you shall be brought down to Sheol,

'heavy stone' – the gospel(???)(Matt. 21:44). To reject the gospel is to invite judgment.

'in that day' occurs seven times in chapter 12. Usually points to a far future time period. In this case, it is pointing to the just before the Second Coming of Christ.

Even though all nations will gather against Israel, God will intervene and save and protect them.

The demonic hatred of Israel that many feel will drive them to try to eliminate its existence. But God will protect them from annihilation. Messing with Israel would be like trying to grab a porcupine with your bare hands.

The hatred of Israel is fueled by Satan. He wanted to sit on the throne in heaven but ended up being banished from heaven (Isa. 14:13-15). The next best thing would be for him to sit on the throne in Jerusalem. But for that to happen the Jews must be eradicated.

'all the nations are gathered against it' – Hundreds of United Nations resolutions have been issued against Israel since it reformed as a nation. Almost more than the rest of the world combined. This is likely the battle described in (Rev. 16:14; Joel 3:1-2).



Notes:

The people of God must receive the Son of God and that is only possible by the Spirit of God.

As the Jews are in the midst of their greatest distress, God will intervene and save them. In the time of 'Jacob's trouble', the Tribulation, the Antichrist will break the false peace and wage war on God's people.

About two-thirds of the Jews will die as they attempt to escape. Those who survive will be protected by God in the wilderness. After Jesus returns and defeats all His enemies, He will present Himself to the Jews and they will recognize Him as their Messiah and be save (Rom. 11:26).

The Jewish people are far from God. Even those who say they worship Him do not do so in Spirit and in truth because they reject their Messiah Jesus (2 Cor. 3:12-15). These next verses remind us that their rebellion does not change God's plan to save them and make them His people in Christ (2 Cor. 3:16).

Why do the interpreters capitalize Spirit?

"Spirit" - (Ezek. 39:29; Joel 2:28-29)

'they will look on Me whom they pierced.' – Jesus was pierced in His hands, feet, and side at the crucifixion (John 19:34-37). Jesus still bore the marks of being pierced after the resurrection (John 20:27).

It is not God's desire to just save the Jews physically from their enemies – He wants to save them spiritually.

It is the outpouring of the Spirit of grace and supplication that will cause the Jews to see Jesus as their Messiah and repent and be saved.

Even though it was a Roman soldier who pierced Jesus' side, the Jews were the ones who handed Him over to the Romans and bear the guilt of that sin (Matt. 27:23-25).

2 Chronicles 35:22-25 - Nevertheless Josiah would not turn his face from him, but disguised himself so that he might fight with him, and did not heed the words of Necho from the mouth of God. So he came to fight in the Valley of Megiddo.

23 And the archers shot King Josiah; and the king said to his servants, "Take me away, for I am severely wounded." 24 His servants therefore took him out of that chariot and put him in the second chariot that he had, and they brought him to Jerusalem. So he died, and was buried in one of the tombs of his fathers. And all Judah and Jerusalem mourned for Jerish

25 Jeremiah also lamented for Josiah. And to this day all the singing men and the singing women speak of Josiah in their lamentations. They made it a custom in Israel; and indeed they are written in the Laments.

Is this referring to a specific event in history? Probably referring to the death of King Josiah (2 Chron. 35:22-27).

This mourning will be over the realization that for two thousands years they have been guilty of rejecting and crucifying their Messiah.
