#### Luke 6:27-36

#### **Opening Comments**

- Turn to **Luke 6**
- We continue a study through the Gospel of Luke The Stories of Life
- In my life I have been in positions where I was responsible for hiring people
- In addition to trying to determine if they were going to be a good fit for the company, I would attempt to convince them that they should really want to work for us
- That way, if we did offer them a position, they were more likely to accept it
- In the last message Jesus chose the twelve men who be His apostles, His closest companions while He was doing His public ministry
- They would also be tasked with carrying on His ministry after He was gone
- Only Jesus could use the technique that He used to explain to them what it was going to be like to be on His team
- They would be poor and hungry, they would weep and be hated and rejected because they were His disciples
- There were thousands of people standing around Jesus listening to this sermon
- But it was directed at a much smaller group His disciples
- These were men who had already said they would follow Jesus
- Once you become a true disciple of Christ, following Him becomes what life is about
- All the other things are just things big things, but not bigger than following Christ
- Last week, we saw what it meant to follow Christ
- Today we are going to look at the traits of a disciple
- 7 traits that set a man or woman apart as a true disciple of Christ
- These seven traits are not natural

- If it weren't for Christ and the working of the Holy Spirit in a disciple's life, they wouldn't live like this
- If we will embrace these traits and allow the Holy Spirit to develop them within us, we will live the life of a true disciple, a life like Jesus
- Let's pray and then look at these traits
- <u>Pray</u>

#### Teaching

#### <u>An Unnatural Story</u>

- The first four unnatural traits of a disciple are found in verses 27 & 28
- <u>Luke 6:27-28</u>
- The first unnatural trait of a true disciple Love your enemies
- The very first one seems impossible love those who hate you
- The word love there is the Greek word 'agape' this is volitional love – it is choosing to love without regard to the worthiness of the object of that love
- It is how God loves **Romans 5:8**

# God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

- Every one of us, before we came to Christ, was an enemy of God
- God loved us while we were His enemies
- True disciples of Christ show that love, even to those who are hostile toward them
- It is something they choose to do not about feelings
- They ask God to change their hearts and show them how to love them
- The second unnatural trait of a disciple Do good to those who hate you
- The natural thing to do is to stay away from those who hate you, to avoid them
- Jesus says you need to think of good things to do for them **Proverbs** 25:21-22

If your enemy is hungry, give him bread to eat; and if he is thirsty, give him water to drink; for so you will heap coals of fire on his head, and the LORD will reward you.

- If you have a neighbor who doesn't like you and you see their trash can is knocked over pick it up and clean up the trash
- It's not your responsibility, unless you are a true disciple of Christ
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- Who knows If God can't make it so that that enemy can't become a friend, or better yet a true disciple of Christ simply because you did good in the name of Christ
- The third unnatural trait of a true disciple Bless those who curse you
- To bless is to invoke divine favor to curse is to invoke divine harm
- The natural response to someone cursing you is to react with cursing of your own
- A true disciple wants God to bless his or her enemies in the hopes that they will have a real encounter with the living God and be changed
- A true disciple would never pray that anyone created in the image of God would be harmed
- Especially if you understand their destiny apart from Christ
- The fourth unnatural trait of a true disciple is **Pray for those who spitefully use you**
- The phrase 'spitefully use' = to mistreat, speak maliciously against, threatening, to abuse verbally, to use foul or abusive language towards or about mean and hurtful words
- Words hurt and some people are masters at hurting other people with their words
- A true disciple puts the hurt aside and prays for that mean person
- For God's love, grace, and mercy to wash over them
- For healing from whatever causes them to be like that
- The fifth unnatural trait of a true disciple **Do not retaliate**
- <u>Luke 6:29</u>
- The natural response to being harmed is to retaliate to strike back, and typically with more intensity than was done to you
- The idea here is not to ask them to hit you again it is to forgive them
- To forgive them so completely that you expose yourself to being hurt by them again
- Forgiveness nullifies every reason for retaliation or revenge
- Jesus was hit several times as He approached the cross
- He was fully capable of responding in heavenly power Matthew 26:52-53

But Jesus said to him, "Put your sword in its place, for all who take the sword will perish by the sword. Or do you think that I cannot now pray to My Father, and He will provide Me with more than twelve legions of angels?

• And then from the cross, He uttered the ultimate expression of this trait Luke 23:34

Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do.

- Later, Stephen, while he was being stoned to death said the same thing
- The life of a true disciple is not natural
- The sixth unnatural trait of a true disciple is **Gives freely**
- <u>Luke 6:30</u>
- Generosity is one of the traits of a true disciple
- In verse 35, it says that if you live the life of a true disciple that your reward from God will be great
- The more we believe that the rewards of heaven are great, the less value we place on things of the earth
- We have to use wisdom in this there are people who will take advantage of the generosity of God's true disciples
- God calls you to be a good steward of what he has entrusted into your care
- But your inclination should be to give to those who need **Proverbs** 3:27-28

Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in the power of your hand to do *so*. Do not say to your neighbor, "Go, and come back, and tomorrow I will give *it*," when *you have* it with you.

- You might get taken advantage of occasionally, but then your reward from God is infinitely greater
- The seventh unnatural trait of a true disciple of Christ is **Treat others the way you want to be treated**
- <u>Luke 6:31</u>
- This is known as the Golden Rule
- This is not natural it is not easy
- God created us to be in community with other people
- And much of our lives are spent reacting to what other people are doing around us or trying to protect ourselves from what they might do
- Jesus calls us to a higher life not focused on what they are doing, but on what we should be doing

- It is a proactive life of doing good to others
- Turn to Matthew 22
- Jesus says this is very pleasing to God Matthew 7:12

Therefore, whatever you want men to do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets.

- The Law and prophets show us the things that please and displease God
- Jesus summarizes the whole Old Testament with the Golden Rule
- Jesus summarizes the Old Testament in another place
- <u>Matthew 22:35-40</u>
- The whole of the Old Testament hangs on two things; love God and love others
- In that we find the motivation of a true disciple of Jesus Christ love
- Love is God's motivation for everything He does, and it is to be the motivation of everything we do also
- Turn back to Luke 6
- A true disciple Jesus Christ lives a life that is unnatural it is different than that of the rest of the world
- That what Jesus says as we prepare to close this message
- <u>Luke 6:32-34</u>
- If you relate to others in the same manner as sinners, or unbelievers, how does that make you better
- A better way to live is by the unnatural life of a disciple of Christ
- It may not be an easy life but it is worth it?
- <u>Luke 6:35-36</u>
- Embrace those seven traits of a true disciple and you will glorify God, bless others, and grow in your faith
- 'your reward will be great' In heaven there will be rewards for faithful service to God –
- Not sure what those rewards are but they are 'great'
- Then, 'you will be sons of the Most High' = will be like God
- You will never be God, but we are capable of reflecting His nature into this world
- That is what God is doing through the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives **Romans 8:29**

For whom He foreknew, He also predestined *to be* conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren.

- Jesus lived these seven traits perfectly
- You will not live them perfectly, but if you do embrace them, and allow the Holy Spirit to teach you how to walk in them, I believe you will know an intimacy with God that will transform your life and impact the world around you
- It is not easy, but it is so worth it, and it is what the world needs us to be
- The world is lost and needs true disciples of Jesus showing them the way to God through their unnatural lives
- Love your enemies
- Do good to those who hate you
- Bless those who curse you
- Pray for those who mistreat you
- Do not retaliate
- Give freely
- Treat others the way you want to be treated
- Embrace those seven traits and you will be a true disciple of Christ
- Don't worry about doing them perfectly, just start living them
- God will teach you how to do them better
- Jesus was addressing His disciples about how to live the Christ-like life
- Those disciples changed the world by embracing those traits
- We can change the world too, starting in our own homes
- It begins with a simple confession that you might not be embracing one or more of those seven traits
- And then ask God to give you His love for Him and for others
- Ask the Holy Spirit to teach you how to live like Jesus
- Don't try to be perfect just love God, love others, and grow in your faith
- A true disciple is not perfect, just embracing the Christ-life
- Let's all be true disciples of Christ
